

What's new in Student Accounts?


Payments can only be made directly to vendors/organizations/our schools, <u>not</u> students, parents or other individuals.

What are Student Music Accounts?

McFarland Music Boosters administers Student Music Accounts for McFarland music students who have participated in specific fundraisers such as SCRIP or Butterbraid (not run this year). The money raised by students through these fundraisers is tracked for each student by the Music Boosters and can be used to pay for musicrelated activities or some expenses. The money in a student's account cannot be redeemed for cash and will be forfeit to the McFarland Music Boosters general fund in the event a student graduates or moves from the district with a balance in their fund.

How can I check if my student has money in their Student Account?

There is a link in Infinite Campus. Click on "More" and then look for Ouick Links. Not all students have participated in fundraisers that fund Student Accounts.



How do I request money from a Student Account?

You can find the form toward the bottom of the webpage at https://mcfarlandmusicboosters.we ebly.com/student-accounts.html.
Requests are reviewed for accuracy.

Please use the money in your Student Account. It can be used for music field trip expenses, for the high school music trip opportunities, for instrument rental, marching band polos, or solo & ensemble accompanist fees. Money that is not used after your child has graduated is rolled over into the Music Boosters' general fund.
